As racist rhetoric heats up and anti-immigrant policies are passed elsewhere, how can we help turn the tide, in our communities and across the country?

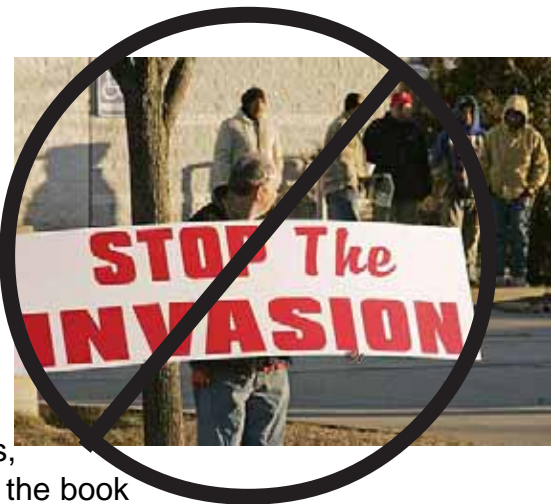
